The MacIntosh Country Inn (<http://www.mcintoshcountryinn.com/>) is conveniently located at the junction of Highway 401 and Junction 31 in the town of Morrisburg, Ontario. The Inn is only a half an hour drive from Cornwall and Brockville, one hour from Ottawa, three and a half hours from Toronto, one and a half hours from Montreal and twenty-five minutes from the U.S. border crossings.

From Toronto or Montreal: Take Highway 401 to exit 750 and proceed south to County Road 2. Turn left and travel one kilometre where you will find the Inn on the north side of the road.

From Ottawa: Take Bank Street (Highway 31) south to County Road 2. Turn left and travel one kilometre where you will find the Inn on the north side of the road.
